1) The DNA of Integrity and Transparency

'A Wesleyan church will have an inbred desire to embody integrity and transparency as a major ethos. Call this "holiness unto the Lord" or "entire sanctification"...



2) The DNA of Universal Value

'A Wesleyan church will also have a deep conviction to share the good news of Jesus with all people regardless of age, creed, gender, race, social status, selfidentity etc. because it fundamentally embraces the universality of the Gospel and Jesus as the universal Saviour....

3) The DNA of Social Transformation and Action

'A Wesleyan church will have an inbred desire to exist to bring social transformation to the context and community it finds itself in. The new church from its conception will be outward-looking, and involved in incarnational ministry in seeking to transform the community it ministers to. John Wesley said, "The gospel of Christ knows no religion but social; no holiness but social holiness."



4) The DNA of a place for the Marginalized and Social Justice

'In my own [Trevor's] denomination, The Church of the Nazarene, Phineas Brezze (founder) was persuaded to choose the name "Nazarene" to emphasis the church's solidarity with the urban poor...'

5) The DNA of Optimism

'As hinted above, a Wesleyan church will always remember that Jesus always goes ahead in working to prepare the ground for the reception of the Gospel. Again, call this "Preventing grace" or "Free Grace" or "Prevenient Grace" if you like, but new healthy Wesleyan churches will enter a community and context with the assurance that the grace of Jesus is already at work in that community....'
